GRAND CHAPTER R.A. M. BUSINESS MEETING

The M.E. Grand High Priest requested the R.E. Grand Secretary to call the roll of the constituent Chapters, two chapters were not represented, Signet Chapter No. 8 and Oregon Trail Chapter No. 65, Gering. This being a constitutional number present, the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Nebraska was declared open for the regular order of business.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND RULES

The Order of Business will be as shown in the printed program for the Convocation, or as may be revised by the Grand High Priest. The committee further recommends:

- 1. The business meeting shall be conducted by "MASONIC TRADITION", not by "Robert's Rules of Order".
- 2. The Grand High Priest shall appoint a *Parliamentarian for the Annual Convocation*. The Parliamentarian shall advise the Grand High Priest as to rules and procedures in conducting the business of the Convocation.
- 3. Committee Reports shall be given by the Chairman or designated member from the podium at the Grand Secretary's table unless otherwise directed by the Grand High Priest.
- 4. All Proposed Amendments must be submitted to the Grand Secretary in writing prior to the close of the Annual Convocation. If unanimous consent is denied, it shall lay over until the next Annual Convocation. One of the signers of any Amendment brought to the floor for discussion shall state the position of the signers prior to the ballot.
- 5. Dais Officers may speak from the East on any motion, resolution, committee report, or other matter. Members of the Grand Chapter may speak from the microphone near the Grand Secretary's desk. In order to obtain the floor, a member first must be recognized by the officer presiding, and then state his name and Chapter before addressing the Grand Chapter.
- 6. No Companion shall speak more than twice on any motion or other matter unless permission is granted by the officer presiding. The order in which members shall be recognized to speak shall be determined by the officer presiding.
- 7. Time limits for speaking on any item of business may be imposed if the officer presiding so announces.
- 8. When the Grand Chapter is considering the decision and formal recommendations of the Grand High Priest, the Grand High Priest shall first announce his position. The Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee then shall announce the position of that Committee. Discussion shall then be opened, with the Grand High Priest permitted to speak, followed by members of the Grand Chapter.
- 9. The method of voting on any item of business shall be determined by the Grand High Priest or other officer presiding.
- 10. Questions of procedure not provided for by the Grand Chapter Constitution and/or Bylaws, or these rules, shall be determined by the Grand High Priest.

GRAND LECTURER REPORT

It was my pleasure to represent the Grand Chapter and be your Grand Lecturer again this year. I was not requested to do much traveling this year by the Grand High Priest. I was also not requested by any Chapters to give them help, perform a school of instruction, or received any

reports from the assistant lecturers throughout the state. The majority of the Chapters have trouble performing opening and closing or know the proper procedures for receiving the Grand High Priest. This is largely due to the fact that Chapters have problems getting enough Companions to open or close. If Chapter Masonry is going to survive in Nebraska, Chapters have to practice the basics of opening and closing even if they only have a few Companions show for the meetings or they will never be able to perform degree work or attract members. If new Chapter Masons cannot gain the further knowledge we promised in their initiation and we only bring them together for boring meeting or call them to a meeting we cannot conduct because of lack of participation then we will not keep them as members.

In looking at exalting new members, we had three successful Chapter Festivals in the Omaha and North Platte areas. The Chapters in Lincoln and Plattsmouth continued to show initiative in doing degree work as they have for the last three years. The idea is still out there for the Chapters to continue to work on the basics and work on conferring at least these first two degrees and then we could hold quick festivals in centrally located areas to complete the Most Excellent Master and Royal Arch Degrees.

I am still in need of more active Assistant Lecturers to review opening and closing at a minimum with the Chapters because there is no way on a consistent basis for the Grand Lecturer to get around or be close enough to help all Chapters in the state. I appreciate the work of those assistant lectures who have assisted their Chapters this year, but we need to have more of the younger members step up to be Assistant Lecturers. I am happy to work with those who are not fully proficient and conduct schools to train these lecturers if we can get participation and some excitement from the Chapters to attend the schools if scheduled. If we are going to improve our ritual capability then these lecturers really need to do quarterly reports at a minimum concerning their efforts to visit chapters and improve the Grand Chapters capability to do degree work across the state. The goal would be to balance the assistant lectures out over the state and really work on ritual work in all the Chapters. If the Chapters are to continue and grow at all we will also need to implement visits to assigned Chapters like Blue Lodges and determine Chapter's ability to open and close.

PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF CHAPTERS

To preserve Chapters, the Eastern College #138 of York Rite Sovereign College of Nebraska has supported two specific activities. First, we have invited all Chapters of Royal Arch Masons to bring their candidates to Omaha, where Florence Chapter #61, with support from Omaha Chapter #1, will perform all four degrees—Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master, and Royal Arch Mason—on their candidates. This work is performed by proficient York Rite Masons, four of whom hold the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International Medal in recognition of their proficiency. The work presented and received is excellent. Second, the Eastern College #138 took this show on the road in 2015 and 2017 to North Platte, Nebraska, 280 miles west of the Omaha Area. In 2015, this same group of York Rite Masons put on the four Chapter Degrees, the two Council Degrees, and the three Commandery Orders in a One-Day Festival for York Rite Masons from Chadron, McCook, North Platte, and Scottsbluff. In 2017, the Eastern York Rite College #138 again traveled to North Platte to put on the four RAM Degrees. All total, we have exalted approximately 15 Master Masons into Royal Arch Masonry.

The western Nebraska Chapters in Chadron, Hastings, McCook, North Platte, Scottsbluff, as well as Beatrice, Columbus, Superior, and Tekamah generally suffer from low membership and even lower attendance. These One-Day Festivals breathe new life into the Chapters by adding new Companions, who attend and want to learn. We will continue this effort, inviting all candidates to Omaha and traveling to North Platte to perform the One-Day Festivals, until such time as the individual Chapters are able to perform their own work and exalt their candidates. It is much easier to revive a struggling Chapter than it is to re-charter a Chapter that is already closed and has lost all interest in having a York Rite presence in the community.

In the future though the York Rite Bodies, Chapters and Councils may want to consider taking out advertisements in the local Shrine Circus Program book or local newspapers to advertise their events. They may also consider more volunteer options to assist with these events in the

communities they are in as members of the York Rite Bodies of Nebraska to bring attention to great Craft.

As the Editor of the Nebraska supplement to the Royal Arch Magazine I can say we had inputs into all the Magazines that came out, but that it still fell primarily on the editor to type up and come up with input into the supplement section. I highly encourage the Grand Chapter Dias officers and the more knowledgeable Masons in Nebraska that are members of the York Rite or past Grand officers to use this forum to communicate information to all the York Rite members in the state.

The Board of Directors of ROYAL ARCH RESEARCH ASSISTANCE has introduced the Gift for a Gift program. Through the generous contribution of Companion Steven Monrotus, Past Grand High Priest of Missouri, a renowned organist in his own right, three excellent musical discs are now available for a special contribution of only \$150. Each of these discs has been provided with, and includes, appropriate music for many Masonic ceremonial occasions. There are patriotic tunes as well as music for the opening and closing of a Masonic body. There are incidental tunes and processionals to include hymns and other appropriate tunes.

UPDATE

Companions: A few things have been changed since our last update on Royal Arch Research Assistance. Dr. Frank Muziek is now heading our CAPD efforts at the University of Arizona. He completed his move in October 2014 and will now have more PhD researchers than at his previous location at the University of Connecticut. He has sponsored international symposiums on CAPD and has put increased emphasis on trying to determine its cause. We continue to assist the Hearing Health Foundation by sponsoring four researchers in CAPD. We have also committed to \$1,000,000 with Autism Speaks in an effort to correlate signs of CAPD in Toddlers (ages 12 - 36 months) who have Autism.

This past year Nebraska contributed \$880.34 to R.A.R.A.
