CARL C. PLANTS 135TH MOST ILLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER



Carl was born in Pierre, South Dakota on April 1, 1947, to Clark and Lucille Plants. He has one brother David, who is three years younger. He attended public schools in Omaha and then Loup City graduating from high school there in 1965. His main activities in junior high and high school were chorus and band.

After High School he attended Kearney State Teachers College for two years before transferring to the University of Nebraska. There he pursued a Chemical Engineering course of study while working second shift as a shift engineer for a local hotel. In the fall of 1970 he started as a computer operator with what later became better known as Metromail. In 1972 he moved from operations to programming, progressing eventually to systems programming and then Software Manager. After 29 years, he left Metromail and assumed new duties in 2000 with the State of Nebraska as Lead Systems Programmer, where he is still employed at this time. During his time at Kearney State, Carl first met his wife, Carolyn. They re-met and were married 15 years later, when they each brought one son from a previous marriage, Charles and Kent.

Not coming from a Masonic background, Carl was first introduced to Masonry by Carolyn. In 1984 he petitioned Lancaster Lodge #54 in Lincoln and was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in April, 1894. He attained his individual proficiency in 1991, and was honored of serve as Master of that Lodge in 1993. He was further honored to serve as Grand Tyler in 2000. He was commissioned as a Deputy grand Custodian in February 2001 and continues in that position at this time. In the fall of that 1984, he petitioned and joined Temple Chapter #271, Order of the Eastern Star and has held several offices in that Chapter, serving as Worthy patron a total of five times. In 2008 he was appointed to the OES Grand Line, serving as Worthy Grand Patron for the 2011-2012 year. In 2015, the Eastern Star General Grand Chapter appointed him be a General Grand Committee member for Scottish Rite Charities. In 1993 Carl joined the Scottish Rite valley of Lincoln, serving as Venerable Master in 2010; and the Sesostris Shrine where he has been active as a member of the Proficient Past Masters and Ritualistic Divan. In 2001 he joined the York Rite bodies in Lincoln, serving as High Priest of Lincoln Chapter No. 6 RAM in 2010 as well as Illustrious Master for Lincoln Council No. 4, Cryptic Masons that same year. He is currently Treasurer of Lincoln Chapter #6 and Senior Warden for Mt. Moriah Commandery #4, Knights Templar. His other Masonic affiliations include York Rite College #138 and Coer de Leone Chapter of the Red Cross of Constantine.

GRAND COUNCIL CRYPTIC MASONS BUSINESS MEETING

The M.I. Grand Master requested that the R.I. Grand Recorder call the roll of constituent Councils and named *Companion Don Monnette* as parliamentarian. Twelve (12) out of thirteen councils were represented, Temple No. 20 was not in attendance. There being a constitutional number of Councils present, the 137th Annual Assembly of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons in Nebraska was declared open for the regular order of business and the ballot box was declared open.

The M.I. Grand Master appointed the following Companions to serve as tellers: *Companions Steven Barchus, Chairman, and James Clark and Donald Gray*.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND RULES

The Order of Business will be as shown in the printed program for the Assembly, or as may be revised by the Illustrious Grand Master. The committee further recommends:

- 1. The business meeting shall be conducted by "MASONIC TRADITION", not by "Robert's Rules of Order".
- 2. The Illustrious Grand Master shall appoint a *Parliamentarian for the Annual Assembly*. The Parliamentarian shall advise the Illustrious Grand Master as to rules and procedures in conducting the business of the Assembly.
- 3. Committee Reports shall be given by the Chairman or designated member from the podium at the Grand Recorder's table unless otherwise directed by the Illustrious Grand Master.
- 4. All Proposed Amendments must be submitted to the Grand Recorder in writing prior to the opening of the Annual Assembly.

 One of the signers of any Amendment brought to the floor for discussion shall state the position of the signers prior to the ballot
- 5. Dais Officers may speak from the East on any motion, resolution, committee report, or other matter. Members of the Grand Council may speak from the microphone near the Grand Recorder's desk. In order to obtain the floor, a member first must be recognized by the officer presiding, and then state his name and Council before addressing the Grand Council.
- No Companion shall speak more than twice on any motion or other matter unless permission is granted by the officer presiding.The order in which members shall be recognized to speak shall be determined by the officer presiding.
- 7. Time limits for speaking on any item of business may be imposed if the officer presiding so announces.
- 8. When the Grand Council is considering the decision and formal recommendations of the Illustrious Grand Master, the Illustrious Grand Master shall first announce his position. The Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee then shall announce the position of that Committee. Discussion shall then be opened, with the Illustrious Grand Master permitted to speak,

- followed by members of the Grand Council.
- 9. The method of voting on any item of business shall be determined by the Illustrious Grand Master or other officer presiding.
- Questions of procedure not provided for by the Grand Council Law, or these rules, shall be determined by the Illustrious Grand Master.

I will say it again, the youth are our future! This has been said many times over the years and it cannot be repeated often enough. If you have a DeMolay Chapter, a Rainbow Assembly or a Jobs Daughters Bethel in your area, please, attend and support them. They appreciate us being there and in attendance at their meeting and functions. If there is not one in your area, do the research and find out what it would take to create one; and do not forget to involve the ladies in this task. Their knowledgeable support will be a key to getting things started and keeping a new venture going.

If anyone in a Masonic leadership positions accomplishes everything he desired to do, he set his sights far too low. I was able to attend three of our neighboring North Central jurisdictions this term, Iowa, Minnesota and South Dakota. I hope to be able to continue to visit them and get to the other jurisdictions in the future. At this writing I have visited slightly over half of our Nebraska Councils and have enjoyed those visits. I hope to get to most of the others before Grand Session. The visits have all been interesting and underscore the fact that all of us, in Nebraska and throughout our region, facing the same issues.

This was due to a situation that was brought to our attention by our Grand Secretary/Recorder and we could not find a way to work with them to address their situation and keep them open.

At this point, I may as well speak to the elephant in the room, membership. We have seen some progress in the Omaha area Councils; in Lincoln, we have started to rebuild as well. I cannot speak for the Omaha area, but I know that in Lincoln our new members have been the results of efforts by only two or three individuals. They have not been afraid to actually go into the Lodges to talk about York Rite Masonry. If you go, wear your York Rite aprons proudly and be prepared to answer the questions; if you can't field the question, promise to get back to them – and then do it. And take petitions with you. I know that I never dreamed of being up here before you today. Someone talked to me and gave me a petition to sign – you never know what may happen. Maybe some of you are afraid that if you have a candidate you will be called upon to do the work. Ask for help. The York Rite Colleges are there to help. Also individuals will be glad to assist. The Omaha area regularly does festivals twice a year

and they have been sponsoring festivals in North Platte. Their only requirement is that they have a "reasonable" number of candidates for the travel situations, and that individuals from the sponsoring York Rite Bodies are present with their candidates.

I have a special thank you for the Grand Council officers. You accepted your positions, some of you with no awareness of what you were getting into. Thank you for what you do for all branches of Masonry. I hope to see you more in the future.

A special thank you also to IM Mike Lageaux and to the members of Lincoln Council #4 for opening our Grand Session. I know that you did a fantastic job and I appreciate the work that you all have done the year. And a special thank you to my wife, Carolyn. Thanks for all your love and support this last year and the years leading up to this. It would not have been possible without you by my side.

PLM COMMITTEE ACTION ITEMS AS OF DECEMBER31, 2016

At the 2015 meeting of the Perpetual Life Membership Committee, the following distribution policy was adopted:

The annual distribution of PLM funds to Chapters of Royal Arch Masons, Councils of Cryptic Masons, and Commanderies of Knights Templar in Nebraska is a target rate of three (3) percent of the PLM ending account value as of December 31 of each calendar year. The target rate could be adjusted annually (either positively or negatively) based on the PLM fund's annual return and a decision of the committee. RBC Wealth Management should maintain approximately \$7,000 in cash at the end of each calendar year to allow for the annual distribution.

There were no changes in the distribution policy at the 2016 meeting for the PLM Committee. Consequently, the 3 percent rule was applied resulting in a distribution of \$6,706.97 to the bodies comprising the Grand York Rite of Nebraska.

Publicity of Council of Cryptic Masons activities has primarily focused on face-to-face discussions, telephone calls, emails, letters among its members, and visits by the Grand Illustrious Master and to a lesser extent, unfortunately, the other Grand Council Officers. All Grand York Rite Officers have a role in communicating with our Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies, and if they want to lead the organization, must start by communicating with their respective bodies. Unlike its Chapter and Commandery counterparts, Grand Council does not have a monthly magazine or a capability to publish a few pages of Nebraska Happenings. In the Omaha area, and to a lesser extent in the Lincoln area, Council activities are published in a Masonic Unity calendar and sent to all Masons. This calendar shows locals events for all Lodges; Chapter, Council, Commandery, and College in York Rite; Valley of Scottish Rite; Shrine Temple, Units, and Clubs; Eastern Star Chapters; and DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow. This "master calendar" serves to inform the Masonic community of upcoming events and to de-conflict multiple similar events. More recently, Grand Lodge has taken up the master scheduling cause and publishes a statewide schedule for all those who wish to go to the GLNE.org website and/or to send them a schedule of local events to be added. We heartily support this statewide Masonic calendar for all Masonic bodies, and especially Councils of Cryptic Masons in Nebraska.

These calendars-Omaha, Lincoln, Grand Lodge, and more recently on the Nebraska Grand York Rite website (NEYorkRite.org) are only as good as the inputs they receive. Nebraska York Rite has the capability for more and better information . . . if Companions and Sir Knights will use it. It includes some statewide information for York Rite members relative to the Annual Session, Annual Easter Sunrise Service for Knights Templar, petitions, bylaws, proceedings, forms, calendar of events, Grand York Rite leadership, and a list of upcoming events. Unfortunately, the calendar and upcoming events lists is only populated with Omaha-area activities. For this website to be useful to all Nebraska York Rite Masons, the Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies outside of the immediate Omaha area MUST submit their pertinent information to be included. By making this website the "go to" source of information about Chapter, Council, and Commandery, all York Rite Masons and prospective York Rite Masons would be better served.
