Upon joining the United States Air Force in 1980, he was stationed at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska as a computer programmer. He was raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason in Omaha's Mizpah Lodge #302 in March of 2004 and became a member of the Omaha Valley of the Scottish Rite, Tangier Shrine, and the York Rite in that same year. He was appointed an officer in his Blue Lodge in 2005 and served in each chair successively from Junior Steward through Master, where he presided in 2011. He earned his individual proficiency card from the Grand Lodge of Nebraska in 2016. He has served in a number of capacities at Tangier Shrine including on the Appointed Divan as Captain of the Guard and as First Ceremonial Master. He was Chief of the Tangier Keystone Kops in 2007, and has, since 2006 served as the Editor of the Hot Sands, the monthly magazine of Tangier. A member the Omaha area York Rite Bodies, he is a Past High Priest of Omaha Chapter #1 Royal Arch Masons, Past Illustrious Master of Omaha Council #1, and member of Mt. Calvary Commandery #1.

He currently serves as Program Director of the 520th Software Maintenance Squadron at Offutt Air Force Base, leading sustainment activities on software supporting Minuteman III ICBM warfighters. Having served on active duty for four years and some three decades as an Air Force Civil Servant, he is a patriot who is very proud to have served our great nation and will be forever thankful to the brave men and women who have secured and continue to preserve our liberties.

He is the very proud father of Laura and David, grandfather of McKenzie and Kennedy, and is very lucky to have been married to his awesome wife Marcy for 39 years.

GRAND CHAPTER R.A. M. BUSINESS MEETING

The M.E. Grand High Priest requested the R.E. Grand Secretary to call the roll of the constituent Chapters, two chapters were not represented, Signet Chapter No. 8 and Oregon Trail Chapter No. 65, Gering. This being a constitutional number present, the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Nebraska was declared open for the regular order of business.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND RULES

The Order of Business will be as shown in the printed program for the Convocation, or as may be revised by the Grand High Priest. The committee further recommends:

- 1. The business meeting shall be conducted by "MASONIC TRADITION", not by "Robert's Rules of Order".
- 2. The Grand High Priest shall appoint a *Parliamentarian for the Annual Convocation*. The Parliamentarian shall advise the Grand High Priest as to rules and procedures in conducting the business of the Convocation.
- 3. Committee Reports shall be given by the Chairman or designated member from the podium at the Grand Secretary's table unless otherwise directed by the Grand High Priest.
- 4. All Proposed Amendments must be submitted to the Grand Secretary in writing prior to the close of the Annual Convocation. If unanimous consent is denied, it shall lay over until the next Annual Convocation. One of the signers of any Amendment brought to the floor for discussion shall state the position of the signers prior to the ballot.
- 5. Dais Officers may speak from the East on any motion, resolution, committee report, or other matter. Members of the Grand Chapter may speak from the microphone near the Grand Secretary's desk. In order to obtain the floor, a member first must be recognized by the officer presiding, and then state his name and Chapter before addressing the Grand Chapter.
- 6. No Companion shall speak more than twice on any motion or other matter unless permission is granted by the officer presiding. The order in which members shall be recognized to speak shall be determined by the officer presiding.
- 7. Time limits for speaking on any item of business may be imposed if the officer presiding so announces.
- 8. When the Grand Chapter is considering the decision and formal recommendations of the Grand High Priest, the Grand High Priest shall first announce his position. The Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee then shall announce the position of that Committee. Discussion shall then be opened, with the Grand High Priest permitted to speak, followed by members of the Grand Chapter.
- 9. The method of voting on any item of business shall be determined by the Grand High Priest or other officer presiding.
- 10. Questions of procedure not provided for by the Grand Chapter Constitution and/or Bylaws, or these rules, shall be determined by the Grand High Priest.

GRAND LECTURER REPORT

It was my pleasure to represent the Grand Chapter and you as your Grand Lecturer again this year. Though I did not do much traveling this year I know from past years of traveling as the Grand High Priest and Illustrious Grand Master that the majority of the Chapters have trouble performing opening and closing of Chapters and the proper procedures for receiving the Grand High Priest. This is largely due to the fact that Chapters have problems getting enough Companions to open or close. If Chapter/Capitular Masonry is going to survive in Nebraska, Chapters have to practice the basics of opening and closing or they will never be able to perform degree work or attract members. If new Chapter Masons cannot gain the further knowledge we promised in their initiation and we only bring them together for boring meeting or call them to a meeting we cannot conduct because of lack of participation then we will not keep them as members.

In looking at exalting new members, we had three successful Chapter Festivals in the Omaha and North Platte areas. The Chapters in Lincoln and Plattsmouth continued to show initiative in doing degree work on their own and conferred Mark Master and past Master Degrees. It would really be great if all the Chapters as mentioned above would work on the basics and work on conferring at least these two degrees and then we could hold quick festivals in centrally located areas to complete the Most Excellent Master and Royal Arch Degrees.

We are still in need of more active Assistant Lecturers to review opening and closing at a minimum with the Chapters because there is no way on a consistent basis for the Grand Lecturer to get around or be close enough to help all Chapters in the state. I appreciate the work of those assistant lecturers who have assisted their Chapters this year, but maybe the time has come to reestablish the Grand Chapter Assistant Lecturers and again work on conducting schools to train these lecturers if we can get participation and some excitement from the Chapters to attend the schools if scheduled. If we are going to improve our ritual capability then these lecturers really need to do quarterly reports at a minimum concerning their efforts to visit chapters and improve the Grand Chapters capability to do degree work across the state. The goal would be to balance the assistant lecturers out over the state and really work on ritual work in all the Chapters. If the Chapters are to continue and grow at all we will also need to implement visits to assigned Chapters like Blue Lodges and determine Chapter's ability to open and close.

I see new members excited about the degree work, and wanting to participate within the local Chapters. They are energized and want to contribute. They often times take offices and start the journey up the chairs.

If this excitement continues, then they eventually become High Priest of their respective Chapters, and maybe even into a state leadership position.

That being said, there are many of you who are so apathetic about York Rite and Masonry in general that you and the members of your respective lodges and chapters do nothing.

You watch year by year as your members die off and do nothing. You may come to the Grand sessions of these groups, and want to vote on legislation, but are you even worth? When was the last time you or any member of your Chapter brought someone into Lodge or Chapter? For about half of our Chapters in the great state of Nebraska it would be none for the past 10 years.

This is disgraceful. In the last 10 years we have not replaced our dying members, we have not even replaced our suspensions. When you add this up we see a continuing downward spiral.

There are some Chapters that do degree work on a regular basis and for this I applaud you. But even these Chapters do not have positive growth. We need to retain what we have, and replace the ones that die plus a few.

It would be wonderful if every member replaced himself in the year to come. I know that though this is not too much to ask that this will not happen. So, here is the challenge. Each Chapter should bring in 5 new members. This should not be hard. We need you to bring 5 new members to your lodge, and then bring them into chapter. In 2002 we had over 1800 members in the state. Today we have 939 members in the state.

It does not take a rocket scientist to see what is going to happen if we do not get busy on membership. While things like Shrine Clubs are fun, and a great thing to have access to, I would hate to see our organization diminished to the point of being nothing more than a small club that you can join to possibly learn something about York Rite ritual. Let's not become a footnote in the history of masonry in the state of Nebraska.

To do this we need to work together. If you have candidates and need help, ask. If you do not know how to get members ask for help. If you do not want help, and refuse to do it on your own let us know. I am sure we can arrange for you to become a footnote in the minutes of Grand York Rite in Nebraska. It is time to get back to work gentleman, or shut the light off and stop pretending that you care about this great organization.

The PLM Committee is charged with investing the funds generated by the purchase of perpetual life memberships by members of the three bodies that compose the Grand York Rite of Nebraska. The Committee consists of nine members. Three of whom are elected by the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, three elected by the Grand Council, Cryptic Masons, and three elected by the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar. Currently, the funds are invested through the Garlock Group of RBC Wealth Management. Quarterly Reports are reviewed and an annual meeting is held to review the investment portfolio and make necessary changes. The PLM Committee presents the results of investment decisions made during the 2017 year in the accompanying tables.

PLM COMMITTEE ACTION ITEMS AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2016

At the 2015 meeting of the Perpetual Life Membership Committee, the following distribution policy was adopted:

The annual distribution of PLM funds to Chapters of Royal Arch Masons, Councils of Cryptic Masons, and Commanderies of Knights Templar in Nebraska is a target rate of three (3) percent of the PLM ending account value as of December 31 of each calendar year. The target rate could be adjusted annually (either positively or negatively) based on the PLM fund's annual return and a decision of the committee. RBC Wealth Management should maintain approximately \$7,000 in cash at the end of each calendar year to allow for the annual distribution.

There were no changes in the distribution policy at the 2017 meeting for the PLM Committee. The fund performed well again this year. Consequently, the PLM Committee voted to continue the 3% payout, resulting in a distribution of \$7,738.50 to the bodies comprising the Grand York Rite of Nebraska. Buzz Garlock, our Financial Advisor, suggested we continue to rebalance the portfolio with more of it being in fixed income positions. The rise in the stock funds left us at 12% in fixed income funds, and last year the PLM Committee agreed on a target of 25%. The PLM Committee voted to move \$25,000 from the S & P stock fund into the two bond funds after two good years of performance, so we view this decision as taking some of our profit out our stock funds into bonds.

PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF CHAPTERS

To preserve Chapters, the Eastern College #138 of York Rite Sovereign College of Nebraska has supported two specific activities. First, we have invited all Chapters of Royal Arch Masons to bring their candidates to Omaha, where Florence Chapter #61, with support from Omaha Chapter #1, will perform all four degrees—Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master, and Royal Arch Mason—on their candidates. This work is performed by proficient York Rite Masons, four of whom hold the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International Medal in recognition of their proficiency. The work presented and received is excellent. Second, the Eastern College #138 took this show on the road in 2015 and 2017 to North Platte, Nebraska, 280 miles west of the Omaha Area. In 2015, this same group of York Rite Masons put on the four Chapter Degrees, the two Council Degrees, and the three Commandery Orders in a One-Day Festival for York Rite Masons from Chadron, McCook, North Platte, and Scottsbluff. In 2017, the Eastern York Rite College #138 again traveled to North Platte to put on the four RAM Degrees. All total, we have exalted approximately 15 Master Masons into Royal Arch Masonry.

The western Nebraska Chapters in Chadron, Hastings, McCook, North Platte, Scottsbluff, as well as Beatrice, Columbus, Superior, and Tekamah generally suffer from low membership and even lower attendance. These One-Day Festivals breathe new life into the Chapters by adding new Companions, who attend and want to learn. We will continue this effort, inviting all candidates to Omaha and traveling to North Platte to perform the One-Day Festivals, until such time as the individual Chapters are able to perform their own work and exalt their candidates. It is much easier to revive a struggling Chapter than it is to re-charter a Chapter that is already closed and has lost all interest in having a York Rite presence in the community.

Each of these discs has been provided with, and includes, appropriate music for many Masonic ceremonial occasions. There are patriotic tunes as well as music for the opening and closing of a Masonic body. There are incidental tunes and processionals to include hymns and other appropriate tunes.

UPDATE

Companions: A few things have been changed since our last update on Royal Arch Research Assistance. Dr. Frank Muziek is now heading our CAPD efforts at the University of Arizona. He completed his move in October 2014 and will now have more PhD researchers than at his previous location at the University of Connecticut. He has sponsored international symposiums on CAPD and has put increased emphasis on trying to determine its cause. We continue to assist the Hearing Health Foundation by sponsoring four researchers in CAPD. We have also committed to \$1,000,000 with Autism Speaks in an effort to correlate signs of CAPD in Toddlers (ages 12 - 36 months) who have Autism.

This past year Nebraska contributed \$880.34 to R.A.R.A.
